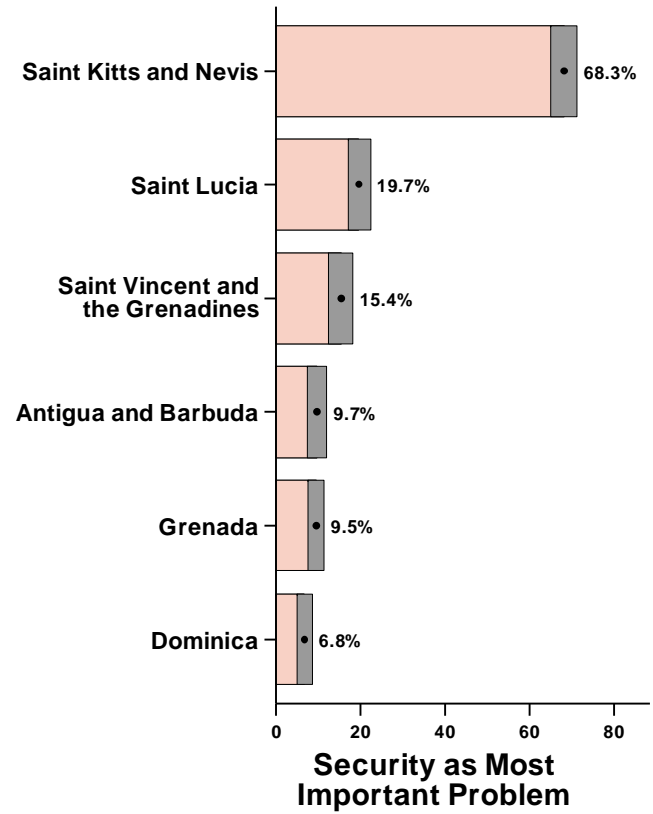
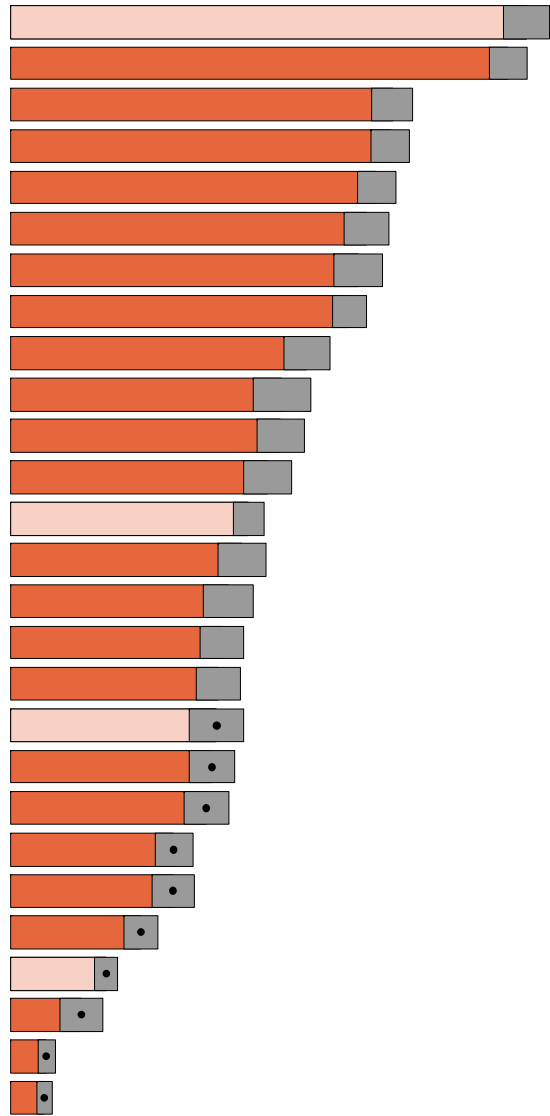

Summary of Selected Findings

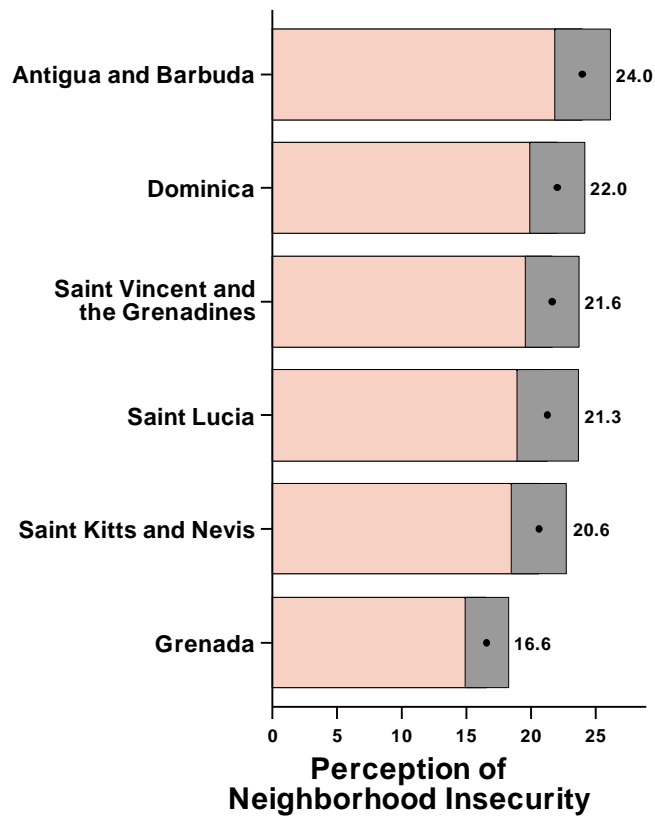
1. A majority in St. Kitts & Nevis, as in Trinidad & Tobago, identify security as the most important problem in their countries
2. Neighborhood insecurity is low in the OECS compared to the rest of the Americas
 - “ Young adults, less wealthy people, and women report higher levels of insecurity
3. Around 1 in 10 people report crime victimization in the past year in Saint Lucia and in Dominica
4. Reports of illegal drug sales in one’s neighborhood are comparatively high in Dominica and St. Lucia
5. 1 in 6 people report murders in their neighborhood in St. Kitts & Nevis and in Trinidad & Tobago

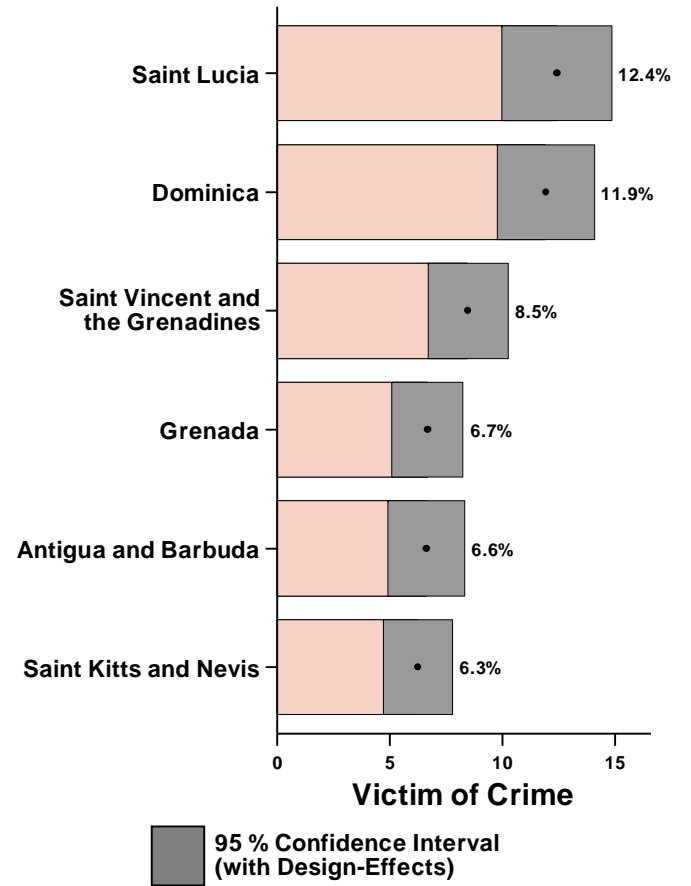
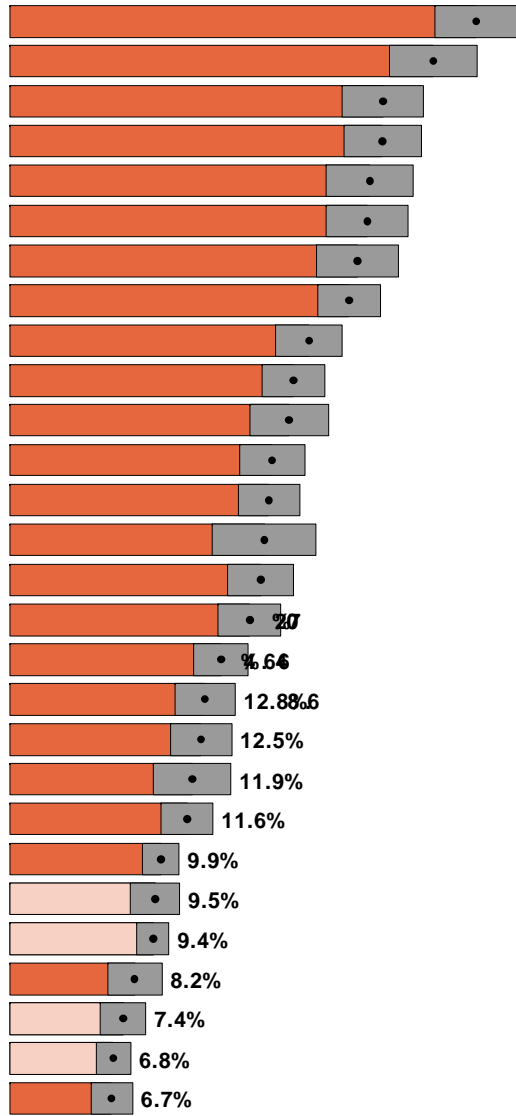
